Smiles as She Pays Fines For Auto Violations.

Chastened to the point where she didn't think that being the wife of a dry snooper made her the first lady of the land, Mrs. Adele J. Tierney, 23, gracefully took punishment in Manhattan Traffic court yesterday.

Mrs. Tierney, who lives with her dry-agent hubby at 1710 Montgomery ave., Bronx, arrived in court when her case was postponed a few weeks ago, armed with abuse for police, court and reporters.

Yesterday the abuse was absent, and she pleaded guilty, with mitigating circumstances, to speeding and passing a signal on Nov. 28. She received fines of \$55. Her attorney produced a death certificate to support her statement that she was rushing to the bedside of her dying father at the time she received her ticket.

Fined as a second offender and not penalized for her abuse, Mrs. Tierney smilingly posed for photographs and viewed optimistically a charge of reckless driving which is still pending against her as the result of a complaint made by another autoist on Nov. 2.

Dr. Pierre Bernard, love-cultist proprietor of the Clarkstown Country club at Nyack, saw another one

of his tenants in durance vile yesterday as H. L. McLaurin, artist and author, was arraigned on a charge of reckless driving and second degree manslaughter.

McLaurin, whose coach struck and fatally injured Orin Shock, 78, well-known Nyack engineer, late Tuesday night, was released in \$2,000 by Recorder O. J. Levison at Nyack.
