

WAGNER SWEARS TWO

Salottolo and Tierney Take Posts in City Courts

Alexander Salottolo was sworn in yesterday by Mayor Wagner as a justice of the Municipal Court, Third Manhattan District. At the same City Hall ceremony the Mayor swore in Raymond A. Tierney of Brooklyn as a City Magistrate.

Justice Salottolo is 53 years old, married and lives at 333 West Fifty-seventh Street. He was appointed to fill a vacancy created by the recent death of Municipal Court Justice Charles J. Garrison. The appointment was for a term expiring Dec. 31, 1956. It carries an annual salary of \$17,000.

City Magistrate Tierney is 54 years old, married and lives at 1064 East Forty-second Street, Brooklyn. His appointment was for a term expiring July 8, 1965. It was made to fill the vacancy created by the death of City Magistrate Harry L. Donnelly. The post carries an annual salary of \$16,000.
