

NEW YORK, April 29. Schooner B. D. Pitts, from Charleston, brings 21 passengers, including the crew of the steamer Nashville, and James Tracy, a native of Ireland, wife and five children.

Tracy had declared his intention to become a citizen, and had a small farm, which was confiscated because he refused to fight against the flag which he had sworn to protect. He was seized and tied to a fence with his hands tied over his head, and given 500 lashes. His wife was kicked and otherwise ill-used. Tracy served in the Mexican war under Gen. Scott.
