
CATHOLIC VIEW DEFENDED

James V. Hayes Praises Defeat of Child Labor Measure

Catholic opposition to the child labor amendment was defended yesterday by James V. Hayes, chairman of the Catholic Affairs Committee of the Knights of Columbus, at the annual communion breakfast of Corrigan Council, Knights of Columbus, at the Concourse Plaza Hotel, 161st Street and Grand Concourse, the Bronx.

Paying tribute to the Assemblymen who voted against the measure despite "pressure brought to bear on them," Mr. Hayes said Catholics were not in favor of ratification of the amendment because of their devotion to "the principles upon which the American government was founded." Catholic legislators do not vote as Catholics, but as "men" applying logic to a political situation," he declared.
