THE PETITION OF Mary Ann Brown of the town of Mount Pleasant in the County of Westchester and State of New York respectfully Showeth:

That your Petitioner is the mother of George W. Clerks, Matilda Clerks, Sarah Maria Clerks, William Clark Clerks, and James Edwin Clerks, and that they are the children of James Oakley Clerks who was a private to C. G. Neg. A. G. Clark & Sons in the service of the United States now deceased and who died in such service on the twenty ninth day of March 1863.

That said Minors are residents of the County of Westchester, and are all under fourteen years of age. That said George W. Clerks

was thirteen years of age on the first day of November last past.

That the said Matilda Clerks, was eleven years on the nineteenth day of March last past.

That the said Sarah Maria Clerks was eight years of age on the twentieth day of July last past.

That the said William Clerks, was seven years of age on the thirteenth day of March last past.

That the said James Edwin Clerks was five years of age on the ninth day of September last past.

That the only relatives of said Minors residing in the County of Westchester, are your petitioner their mother

That said Minors are entitled to personal property to the value of about a pension by reason of the death of their father, as your petitioner is informed and verily believes. Said father and also by reason of the marriage of their mother who was the widow of their said deceased father) of Ninety six dollars for each year to be divided equally among them until they severally arrive at the age of sixteen years.

And to protect and preserve the legal rights of said Minors, it is necessary that some proper person should be duly appointed the Guardian of their person and estate for the purpose of receiving and procuring such monies or property as would come to them by reason of the death of their said father James Oakley Clerks deceased.
