

Father, Son Die Same Day; To Have Separate Funerals

Funeral arrangements were announced yesterday for James Yerks, 63, and his son, Joseph, 33, who died on Thursday. The father expired at his home, 2077a Fulton st., where he had lived for many years, and the son, who had been ill of pneumonia, died at a local hospital.

Their funeral services will be held one day apart. The father will be buried tomorrow and the son on Tuesday.

Both were born in this borough, where they had lived all their lives. The older Yerks was a retired painter and decorator, well known in his section. The son was a chauffeur and unmarried.

Alfred and Sadie Yerks, children of James Yerks, will be the principal mourners at both services. The Rev. Henri Gondret, pastor of Grace Gospel Church, Saratoga ave. and Bainbridge st., will conduct the services for the father at his home tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock.

The same minister will officiate

at services for the son at the funeral parlors of Benjamin Grindrod, 27 Hull st., Tuesday morning at 10:30 o'clock. Both will be buried in Evergreens Cemetery.

James Yerks was a member of Court Ridgewood, Foresters of America.
